

# Asociația Neemia Prayer Notes April 2014

Remus Termen is a leader of the local Church in Dorohoi and his was one of the first families to offer us hospitality during our early visits to Romania. He is a cabinet maker and has a large workshop adjacent to his house. Recently, a neighbour's bonfire got out of control and set fire to the workshop, spreading to his wood stock, his machinery and several vehicles. Remus had recently conducted a successful outreach mission and attributes this personal disaster to 'enemy action', saying simply that "Job suffered more".

### Give thanks ...

1. For the load from west Wales, currently en-route. These loads are essential for AN to be able to continue helping the needy. Last month, donations of goods were valued at  $\pounds$ 6,100; AN also gave  $\pounds$ 1,200 cash to help people with particular needs.

2. For the arrival of Spring; warmer weather and new growth, and also a new season of work in the fields and the opportunity for some to earn a small income.

### Please pray ...

1. For Remus (see above), for Beni who has been diagnosed with a serious spinal disorder and for AN volunteer Iulian who also has long-term health problems - these illnesses will have serious implications for the way in which AN operates.

2. For the arrangements for the Christian summer camp outreach to some of the children of our beneficiary families.
