Loads from west Wales, Sussex and south Wales - including items from elsewhere in the UK - have helped to replenish the warehouse in Dorohoi and are currently being distributed to needy people here. We especially appreciate the generous quantity of sports clothing which has enabled us to provide many local school and club teams with good-quality kit.

1. For three very good loads in the past four weeks.

2. For good weather, which allowed work to progress on the boys' home site without the ground being either too hard to work or becoming a quagmire.

1. For wisdom in distributing the goods received and the resolution of completing demands for resources.

2. That God will overrule in the choice of which children should be invited to attend the summer camp in the mountains.

1. That the beneficiaries in Romania may understand and appreciate the effort that goes into preparing these loads, and the spiritual motivation behind it.

2. For the programme for dispatching loads during the summer - in summer the needy do not go away, their priorities just change a little.

3. For adequate funding, as and when needed, to allow for a timely completion of the new boys' home.
