Unlike many areas further west, the region around Dorohoi is suffering from a shortage of water for farms and gardens. A below-normal amount of snow during the winter has been followed by a dry spring and summer, with only a few rain storms during the past three months. Only those who are able to irrigate their crops have seen good returns for their efforts. Many people here rely on fruit and vegetables prepared during the summer to feed them in the winter, and inadequate rainfall means a poor harvest and hungry times ahead.

Give thanks ...

1. For another valuable load that arrived safely at the end of July. Ironically, it arrived on one of the few days that it rained but fortunately the load included a batch of waterproof jackets.
2. For last month's distribution of goods, primarily clothing, valued at £5,600.

Please pray ...

1. For those suffering in the hot weather - not just with lost crops but also those whose health is being adversely affected.
2. For government initiatives seeking to encourage Romanians to return home to help rebuild the economy and social structure of Romania.
3. About changes in legislation which affect the work of charities in Romania.

An exceedingly generous couple from Newport are donating the fruit from their allotment for jam making. They are then making the jam for sale in order to raise funds for RoAF. So far this year nearly £200 has been raised from jam sales, mainly strawberry and blackcurrant. Other allotment holders are now beginning to join in by donating their fruit as well.

1. For the positive response to the feedback from last month's children's camp - funds have started to come in for next year's camp!
2. For initiatives such as that of the jam makers above, which help to pay the costs of transporting the aid.
3. For funding for the new storage shed at the HBC site on Court Lodge Road.
