Prayer Notes August 2012

Summer temperatures remain in the high 30s C but more significant is the lack of adequate rain. Such rainfall as occurs is often sporadic, with one side of a village battered by short heavy showers that damage the crops whilst the other side receives none at all. All this has serious implications for food supplies during the coming winter, when scarcity and poor quality will raise prices once again.

During July, the office made donations of clothing, household goods, etc, to 112 households or institutions. These goods had a total value of £2,675. The equivalent figures for July 2011 were 117 and £1,631 respectively. Unfortunately, this year many people requesting food have had to be turned away empty-handed.

Give thanks for:

- 1. The resources necessary to be able to continue supplying needs in this area.
- 2. The safe arrival of a fresh load of aid items from the team in Swansea. This is the first consignment sourced, loaded and financed exclusively by the team there, and we praise God for the success of their efforts.
- 3.Despite the critical conditions elsewhere, the warehouse land is producing a viable crop of maize. We hope to mill it into flour for donation later in the year.
- 4.A further donation of Bibles, and the increasing level of interest in spiritual matters amongst our clientele, several of whom have been baptised recently.

Please pray for:

- 1. The political crisis in Romania, with various factions in the government being at loggerheads. The resulting ambiguity and insecurity are delaying provision of essential services. There are signs that voter frustrations are starting to turn into more direct action.
- 2. The return of normal weather patterns, so that those crops which have not been destroyed may recover in time to provide some food stocks for winter.
- 3.Elena Balan, has been in and out of hospital several times recently. She has said that she is ready to die, but she is concerned for her 14 year old grandson, Rares, for whom she is the sole provider.
- 4. Chiprian (7), his grandmother Stela died last week. She was his sole provider.

- 3.The Johnson family in Southend have been keen and generous supporters of RoAF for many years. Please pray for Johnny, who has been diagnosed with the return of a previous cancer and which is causing the family concern.
- 4.Jon Norman is one of the founders of RoAF. Please pray that God will give him confidence and encouragement as he too battles cancer.
