At Casa Neemia we continue to provide accommodation for the community of Romanians and Ukrainians but the operating costs continue to be a drain on AN finances. Solar panels help reduce the electricity costs by some 30% at this time of year. Additionally, some of the residents have been able to make contributions to the costs.

Our warehouse at Dealu Mare is larger than we now need and would lend itself to a more commercial use. The warehouse itself sits on a large plot which used to be outside the village but new housing development surrounds the land, which is now considered to be 'intra-urban' within the local development plan. By selling most of the land as housing plots we could realise funds to acquire or build a smaller warehouse and help with the costs of Casa Neemia. We have received a favourable response from the local council, with a view helping with some of the costs of creating a new access road and creating new land divisions, but we have been warned that the timing is likely to be protracted.

RoAF is essentially a faith-based organisation that relies on prayer. Below and overleaf we offer some prayer pointers, but please feel free to add your own items as they come to mind. Prayer is our connection with God's ultimate power source and, without prayer support, this work would achieve nothing of lasting value.

Shortly before Easter we were invited to make a special food appeal at three local supermarkets. These appeals are undertaken in co-operation with a Romanian national food bank which both provides coordinated publicity materials and gives the appeal a greater credibility. Our teams were present at each store on the Friday, Saturday and Sunday; the goods donated by the stores' customers amounted to some £11,000 in value, and distribution of the food to needy people has already started.

Once again, legislation has been proposed which would introduce more restrictions on the import and sale of second-hand clothing. If enacted, these regulations could have a severe impact on RoAF's activities.
